## KINGSWOOD DEFIB AWARENESS GROUP

Sometimes it takes a major event to raise public awareness. As I write, the near tragic consequences of a cardiac arrest suffered by Danish football star, Christian Eriksen, is in the national and international headlines (fingers crossed that he makes a good recovery).

For many in this village, this news story brings back the tradgedy which befell a Kingswood AFC player in Jan 2013.

The sad fact is that for every survivor, there are many deaths. A good proportion of these losses might have been saved if a defibrillator had been rapidly used.

Ideally, a defibrillator should be with a patient who is suffering a cardiac arrest within 5 minutes of collapse. So you can see why it is very important to have more of them in the community. To help lift the gloom, I have GOOD NEWS. Thanks to a fantastically generous donation from Kingswood Neighbourhood Watch, I have ordered 2 more public access defibs – one intended for the centre of the village and one for the parish. I will be able to give full information and a proper 'thank you' to KNhW in the next edition. This incredible donation has rightly been spent on additional defibs, but that does leave me with the small problem of still raising funds for the Weaver's Close defib. Naturally I have applied for grants etc toward this cost, but currently public donations have only reached about 10% of the cost. So if you can Gift Aid a donation, this will be hugely beneficial. Contact me and I will send a GA form.

In brief, the current 7 defibs are located at: The Spar Shop, The Primary School (Abbey St.), F & G Services Charfield Rd, The Village Hall, Weavers Close, 59 Walkmill Lane, Bramley Close Flats' garage.
