### KINGSWOOD WILDLIFE AREA

Regular walkers will have seen the progress made with hedge laying, which is nearly complete for this year. This is an old hedge which has presented challenges partly due to the amount of dog rose it contains. Preparations were made last year when it was cut so it would be possible to lay it this autumn. Hawthorn, which spreads via roots around the site, has been dug up and replanted to thicken the newly laid hedge. The dog rose will grow back next spring with a beautiful display of flowers in the spring and hips in the autumn. Dog rose flowers are an important nectar source for insects and its fruits are a food source for birds like blackbirds, redwings and waxwings. Thank you to all who are taking your litter home and clearing up after your dogs.

**Parish Council operations during the Coronavirus -** The parish council is operating normally through the Clerk and meeting via publicly accessible conference meetings, as necessary. Full details of meetings will be advertised on the KPC website and social media pages with details of how the public can join the meeting.

Playing field -Dog fouling / litter / vandalism - Please, if you witness any vandalism at the playing field or any anti-social behaviour, report to the Police on 101 and also let KPC know via our usual contact details. We have CCTV at the field and can pass the images on to the Police. Please pass on details of dog fouling or littering to the clerk at the time of the incident. The reporting to KPC of any incident is important so that we can build up a record of when incidences are occurring. This will enable us to review the CCTV and ensure that we are targeting our resources to catch any offenders. Sadly, despite a huge outpouring on Facebook we rarely receive any reports of either dog fouling or litter. Parking - We have received many complaints of inconsiderate parking especially on Wotton Road, Abbey Street and High Street. Please park considerately and in accordance with traffic regulations. When parking please be aware that pedestrians and people with wheelchairs and pushchairs need to be able to access the pavements and move around the village safely.
