The barrier at the entrance is now being locked to prevent unauthorised parking. Please do not risk being locked in by parking in the car park unless attending an event.

KINGSWOOD DEFIB AWARENESS GROUP

Defibrillators are used to help resuscitate patients suffering a sudden cardiac arrest. The main symptoms displayed by a patient in sudden cardiac arrest are: 1) the patient is unconscious (not responding) and 2) the patient is not breathing (or not breathing normally, e.g. gasping).

If you are faced with this situation, do the following, remembering that every second counts: 1) Start CPR chest compressions *immediately* at the rate of nearly 2 pushes per second. Do not stop. 2) Call 999 for the ambulance. If possible get someone else to do this. 3) Collect the defibrillator. Do not stop chest compressions to do this. 4) Follow the defib's very clear audio instructions. The defibrillator is an intelligent machine. It will decide what needs to be done. Remember: you *cannot* harm the patient by using the defib. You can only do good.

Reminder of the current 8 public access defibs in the village and parish are located at: The Spar Shop, (by the pillar box). The Primary School (Abbey Street – by the main entrance door). F+G Services Charfield Road (opposite Tyndale View). The Village Hall, (by the main entrance door). Weavers Close, (at junction with Hillesley Road). 59 Walkmill Lane, (opposite the entrance to the old print-works site). Bramley Close Flats' garages, (opposite Russet Court). New Road (B4058) between Wotton and Charfield, opposite The Round House and the junction to Bradley Green, on the driveway to Hopyard Farm.

Note: there are also restricted hours access defibs at KLB and the Wotton Sports Centre; and one by the all-weather pitches in the Wotton Community Parc behind KLB – which is good for the park run and the Wotton Skate Park.

KINGSWOOD WILDLIFE AREA

The wildlife area is managed by volunteers led by Richard from Stroud Valleys Project. We meet on Monday mornings and new volunteers are always very welcome. This month we have been tackling some of the areas of brambles which spill out of the hedgerows and take over grass areas. Brambles provide a good habitat for wildlife but do need a certain amount of taming. We try to maintain a balance between an area that provides wildlife habitats to protect the great crested newts, encourage birds, insects and wildflowers and one that is pleasant for people to enjoy as they walk through or sit for a while on the benches. Weather and water levels permitting we hope to remove the invasive pond weed from the large newt pond during the winter while the protected newts are not in the pond.

The council will also be looking at a three-year strategic plan for the parish. Please advise the Clerk if there are any projects that you think the council should consider for the future.

Outdoor accessible toilets and Changing Places Unit for the playing field - KPC has prepared an outline specification for outdoor accessible toilets and a Changing Places unit at the playing field. If you would like to assist with this project and have experience with disabilities, please contact the clerk. Playing Field - This is a reminder that the playing field is managed by KPC and is free at the point of use to all members of the community. If you are an organisation or a business user you will need to contact the clerk to the council for the permission and the terms of use.

ANPR - The Parish Council continues to monitor the high speeds picked up by the cameras with the police writing to offenders detected by them. Because speeds are regularly still too high the council is going to resume Community Speedwatch at suitable sites previously agreed with the police. Anybody interested in volunteering to help with this should contact the Clerk in the first instance. The sessions are only allowed to take place during daylight hours in fine weather and the more volunteers we have the more often we can do it.
