Before Christmas we did a lot of work cutting back the old hedge around the Great Crested Newt Pond. We are now in the process of laying the hedge which will ensure it regenerates new growth. If you regularly walk this path watch out for our progress. We have also been clearing around the Old Dew Pond to let in more light and hopefully improve the water quality. It will be interesting to see the effect this has on the newt surveys which we'll be doing in May. We meet on Monday mornings most weeks (weather permitting) from 10.30am. We are always glad of extra volunteers, and welcome people to stop for a chat about what we do and to watch how we lay the hedges. Local Council Tax – The parish council reviewed its budget and objectives for 2020 and has agreed a precept increase of 5% from £100,899 to £ 105,945. The tax base has increased from £555.93 to £583.08, as a result the average annual band D amount will increase from £181.50 to £181.70, an annual increase to the taxpayer of 0.11% or 20p for the year.

District and Parish Council Elections: These will take place on Thursday 7th May 20. If you would like to stand as either a District or Parish Councillor, you will need to complete the nomination paperwork. This needs to be completed from Mon March 23rd and closes on Wed 8th April 20. All nominations must be delivered by hand to Stroud District Council's Offices. Nomination packs will be available from 11th February 20 and can be obtained from SDC or KPC Clerk. SDC are holding a briefing session at Ebley Mill on Mon 9th March at 5.30pm. The number of Councillors for Kingswood has increased to 8. Please see the website for information on Local Government. If you are interested in standing for Kingswood Parish Council and want to find out more, please attend a parish council meeting or speak to a current councillor or the clerk. It is important that enough people come forward and stand for the council. Currently KPC has an additional Power called the General Power of Competence and has achieved the Local Council Award. These will be lost if we do not have enough people prepared to stand as a Parish Councillor (There must be an election). Please think about taking on this role and representing your community at a local level. Training will be available for new councillors.

Local Plan Consultation- Thank you to everyone who has completed the parish council survey and who attended the Public meeting. The results of the survey will be displayed on the parish council website. If you have not already done so, please make your comments directly to Stroud District Council. Although the consultation has ended the council has indicated that they are flexible and will accept comments after the deadline.

Section 106 Consultation- Thank you to all took part. The top two choices are a fence around the play equipment and publicly accessible toilets. We will now agree specifications for both projects. Once we have more details, we will share this information with the community. We will also look at further improvements to the playing field as indicated by the community in the survey

The Ash Path— A big Thank you to the Community Resilience Fund which has awarded a grant of £1200 to help pay for the improvements.

Footpath CKD 16 Rectory road (Opposite the Spar) to Chestnut Park. The KPC is funding improvements to this footpath.

KINGSWOOD DEFIB AWARENESS GROUP

Charfield Road 'public access defib': Kingswood's 5th 'community Public Access Defibrillator' (cPAD) has been fully operational since the 8th November, but funds are still being raised. If you can help, please contact David.

Defibrillators are used to help resuscitate patients suffering a sudden cardiac arrest. The main symptoms displayed by a patient in sudden cardiac arrest are: 1) the patient is unconscious (not responding) and 2) the patient is not breathing (or not breathing normally e.g. gasping). If you are faced with this, do the following: - Commence CPR chest compressions *immediately* at the rate of nearly 2 pushes per second. Do not stop, unless you chose to give 2 breaths after every 30 pushes. - Call 999 for the ambulance. If possible get someone else to do this. - Collect the defibrillator. Do not stop chest compressions to do this. Then follow the defib's very clear audio instructions. - The defibrillator is an intelligent machine. It will decide what needs to be done. - Remember: you *cannot* harm the patient by using the defib. You can only do good. The locations of the five 24/7 defibs in Kingswood are listed on the kingswoodgrapevine website which includes a map marking the 5 sites.
