## COMBATTING LONLINESS IN KINGSWOOD - An open letter from the KCAG

When the Covid pandemic first struck us back in 2020, the Kingswood Community Action Group (KCAG) was formed under the auspices of the Kingswood Village Association (KVA), to support vulnerable people in our village adversely affected by the disease and associated lockdowns and isolation. A group of volunteers came forward and they have done a heroic job in responding to the needs of our community in a time of crisis and their work is ongoing. Well over a hundred people in the village have benefited so far from numerous acts of kindness and support and many genuine new friendships have been forged as a result. This has been a fantastic community effort and heartfelt thanks goes out to those who contributed and who continue this good work.

One issue that emerged loud and clear is that loneliness is a critical issue. People have, rightly, become extra cautious as a result of the pandemic and this has meant that social interaction has been severely impacted. A significant number of Kingswood residents have been affected by this lack of personal contact leading to increased feelings of loneliness. There are also additional issues around health, age, mobility and a loss of social confidence which also contribute to the isolation that many are experiencing.

As we move into 2022 and start learning how to live with Covid, we believe that it is time to do something about loneliness in Kingswood and our goal is to reach out to everyone who is affected and to be in a position to offer whatever support we can. As the KCAG was only ever intended to be an emergency initiative, we now feel the need to build on what has been achieved and we appeal to our community to come forward to help create a new group which can put things on a sustainable footing for the future. With this in mind we are inviting any interested individuals and all organised village groups to make contact and express their willingness to support and to take part in a meeting in the near future to start planning a way ahead. The hope is that by joining forces we can take forward the good work of KCAG and put in place a social plan that will enable us to help and support everyone in our community who needs and wants it.
