All nomination must be delivered by hand to Stroud District Council's Offices by either the nominee the proposer or seconder between Monday March 23 - Wednesday 8th April 20 between 10.00am and 4pm. Alternatively, the Elections Officer will be at the Kingswood village hall on Monday 30th March from 10.am to 4pm to receive completed nomination papers. If you will have a problem in delivering your completed papers, please contact the clerk KPC and she will help with this process.

The number of Councillors for Kingswood has increased to 8. A number of the current councillors have indicated that they will not be standing for election. It is therefore important that we have people coming forward to stand at this election. Currently KPC has an additional Power called the General Power of Competence and has achieved the Local Council Award. These will be lost if we do not have enough people prepared stand as a Parish Councillor. Please think about taking on this role and representing your community at a local level.
