### **CITIZENS ADVICE - STROUD & COTSWOLD**

On 1 April 2021, the energy regulator Ofcom raised the price cap on standard and default energy tariffs. For the average household, bills are set to rise by £96 a year. The new cap isn't the maximum users will pay, the cap sets a limit on the rates you pay for gas and electricity, so the more you use, the more you pay.

This is now a good time to see if you can save money by switching. In the last 5 months, Citizens Advice Stroud and Cotswolds Districts have helped 175 households with energy issues. This includes saving money by switching, helping clients switch to green energy suppliers, helping clients understand their energy bills and usage and finding grants and financial support for clients.
