NEWS: Kingswood's 6th Defibrillator has arrived.

A new defibrillator has been located toward the far end (East) of Walkmill Lane. It is installed on the front wall of No 59 Walkmill Lane, which is on the South East side, (right hand side as you go down Walkmill Lane), and is opposite the footpath, which leads to Golden Lane / Vineyard Lane. Importantly this is now the closest defib for users of The Ash Path.

Huge thanks to Annie and Danny for demonstrating such community spirit by allowing the defib cabinet to be mounted on the front wall of their house. Ideally a defibrillator should be with a patient who is suffering a cardiac arrest within 5 minutes of collapse. You can see why it is so important to have more in the community.

I am still raising funds to meet the cost of this new defib, so if you can Gift Aid a donation, this will be hugely beneficial – I can give you payment details. The position of the new defib will shortly be added to the list and map to be found on the Grapevine website at http://www.kingswoodgrapevine.btck.co.uk

Defibrillators are used to help resuscitate patients suffering a sudden cardiac arrest. The main symptons displayed by a patient in sudden cardiac arrest are: 1) the patient is unconscious (not responding) and 2) the patient is not breathing (or not breathing normally e.g. gasping). If you are faced with this, do the following:

- Commence CPR chest compressions immediately at the rate of nearly 2 pushes per second. Do not stop, unless you chose to give 2 breaths after every 30 pushes.
- Call 999 for the ambulance. If possible get someone else to do this.
- Collect the defibrillator. Do not stop chest compressions to do this.
- Then follow the defib's very clear audio instructions.
- The defibrillator is an intelligent machine. It will decide what needs to be done.
- Remember: you cannot harm the patient by using the defib. You can only do good.

GROUP ACTIVITIES - Our regular group activities came to a rather abrupt halt in mid-March, but we kept in touch with our members and volunteers with a combination of social media, emails, and good old Royal Mail. We sent out rainbows to stick in windows, telephoned each other to keep our spirits up, and even organised a remote version of our annual Sunflower Competition. Parish Council operations during the Coronavirus - The parish council is operating normally through the Clerk and meeting via a publicly accessible conference meetings, as necessary. Planning -There are two current planning applications: S.20/0887/FUL - Land at Cloverlea Barn Wickward Road for 58 dwellings. S.20/1083/OUT Land South of Charfield Road for 50 dwellings. Please view the details on www.stroud.gov.uk Playing field - At the beginning of September we experienced a higher level than usual of anti social behaviour at the playing field. Fortunately, we have CCTV and the images have been shared with the Police. Please, if you witness any vandalism, report to the Police on 101 and also let KPC know via our usual contact details. Please pass on details of dog fouling or littering to the clerk at the time of the incident.

Public Toilets - The toilets remain closed due to a water leak somewhere outside the building; we will replacie the mains water pipe that supplies the toilets soon which unfortunately will cause a little disruption. However, the good news is after the work is finished we will be able to re-open the toilets. Weeding - Please can we all take a moment to look at the area outside our homes. In particular weeds in the gutter and on the pavement and overgrown hedges. Please can we ask you to take the time to tidy up the area outside your house. The removal of weeds will help with the flow of rainwater and make the roads look tidier. Overgrown hedges can cause an obstruction on the pavement forcing people on to the road. Thank you for your help on this. Cemetery Bin - The bin at the cemetery is provided for the use of cemetery holders only and not for domestic waste. Speeding - The Police recently provided the August stats for vehicles detected speeding through the village, of the 23 motorists issued warning letters, 8 are from Kingswood. Please can all members of the community observe the speed limit.
