#### KINGSWOOD WILDLIFE AREA

During September we have been making the most of good weather and keeping the footpaths cut. Some of the areas of longer grass have been scythed or cut with a strimmer. Where the longer grass contained thistles, nettles and hawthorn shoots we have needed to use a brush cutter. The hedges are being trimmed and tidied to keep branches away from the footpaths. We meet on Mondays from about 9.45 and new volunteers are always welcome. The more volunteers we have the more we can do so extra hands are much appreciated. A regular commitment is not necessary, anyone who is only available for occasional weeks can still come along and be involved. If you are passing on a Monday stop and have a chat with one of the volunteers and find out more about what we do.

The electrode pads used by defibrillators last for about 2 years. The cost of replacement pads for most of the village's defibs is covered in the original purchase agreements for the first 8 years. However, the defib pads at the Village Hall, which have just been replaced, needed funding. Because of the model type, both adult and paediatric pads are needed – the latter being expensive. Once again the Karate Club has made a fantastic donation, not only covering the £150+ cost of the pads, but also including a substantial extra amount. Thank you so much Bekki and Rachel.

The other good news is that the recent addition of a defib at the junction of Hillesley Road and Weavers Close is now fully funded thanks both to local donations (as ever, you know who you are, and thank you again) and to a very generous donation from **Renishaw.** 

One of the new defibs funded by **Kingswood Neighbourhood Watch** is now in the process of being installed at the end of the drive to Hopyard Farm, on the Wotton to Charfield road, opposite the junction to the Bradley Green / The Round House. Not only is this an accident blackspot, but, as many will know, it is on the popular footpath between Kingswood and Renishaw. By next month it will be added to the list below as the 8<sup>th</sup> defib in the parish.

In brief, the current 7 public access defibs in the village are located at: The Shop, The Primary School (Abbey St), F+G Services Charfield Road, The Village Hall, Weavers Close, 59 Walkmill Lane, Bramley Close Flats' garages.

KPC has resumed its meetings at the village hall and will meet on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday of the month. The calendar, agenda and meeting papers can be found on our website. The next meeting will be on **Monday 11<sup>th</sup> October 2021.** 

Anti-Social Behaviour - Please will all parents ensure that their children are not causing a nuisance at the playing field at night. We have had complaints of mopeds, loud music and littering. Please report any instances to the Police on 101 and to <a href="mailto:clerk@kingswoodparishcouncil.gov.uk">clerk@kingswoodparishcouncil.gov.uk</a> providing a date and time to assist in finding the incident/evidence on the camera that can then be sent to the Police.

Playing field - KPC is now looking at delivering the outdoor accessible toilets at the playing field and it is intended that this project will be completed by the end of 2022. KPC has placed an expression of interest to access government funding to deliver a Changing Places toilet facility at the Playing field. Currently Kingswood Playing Field has been accepted by Stroud District Council as one of two locations within the Stroud District that they will support. KPC is interested in your views on this type of facility so do please contact the Clerk. The new fence at the playing field is in place, however we have noticed the vehicle access gate is being left open on occasions, which may be due in part to the difficulty in closing it. Due to continued issues with the vehicle access gate, we will be installing a second pedestrian gate next to the vehicle gate. The vehicle access gate will then be locked, and access through it will be for contractors only.

Access - <u>Please</u> can we ask all householders to ensure that their hedges are not causing an obstruction on the pavements, in particular due to brambles, and that the pavement has not been narrowed due to over growth. It is important that wheelchairs and pushchairs can stay safely on the pavements and in some areas this is proving difficult. Please can all householders also check that kerbs and pavement areas are free of weed thereby ensuring that any rainwater can access the drainage system.

**ANPR Cameras** - From the beginning of September the two cameras have recorded just under 22% of vehicles exceeding the speed limit with the highest speed set by a delivery vehicle at 74 MPH leaving the village.

**Litter bins -** The litter bins within the parish are provided by Stroud District Council and are emptied on a Tuesday. These bins are for the use of the community for their litter and dog poo bags when they are out and about. They are not there for businesses to use for their commercial waste or for residential waste. This has been a particular problem in connection with the bin at The Chipping adjacent to the shop.
