KINGSWOOD WILDLIFE AREA

VOLUNTEERS ALWAYS WELCOME. Kingswood wildlife area is located at the rear of Tyndale View and can also be accessed by following the path opposite the Spar shop. The area was created to provide a habitat for the protected Great Crested Newts, who had made the old pond their home, and to be a quiet green space for local people to enjoy. It is managed by local volunteers and led by Richard from Stroud Valleys Project (stroudvalleysproject.org). Other volunteers from Stroud Valleys Project come and help. We meet on Mondays from around 10am. Volunteering requires no special skills or equipment just a love of the outdoors and of wildlife. Apples, pears and plums are abundant on the orchard trees. The plums are ripening quickly and apples and pears will be ready to pick soon. Come and take a look and take some home for a pie!

Lyn and Richard Cole have long wanted a defibrillator sited near their house at 26 Wickwar Rd (the prominent, red brick house on the left as you leave the village). Unfortunately, their house is not a suitable location for a public access defib in a cabinet for a number of reasons - primarily because there is no pavement (enough said!). So Lyn and Richard have bought their own, private defib; but in true community minded spirit, wish it to be known that there is now a defib at this location, which is available whenever they are at home.

The other good news is that the recent addition of a defib at the junction of Hillesley Road and Weavers Close is now fully funded thanks both to local donations (as ever, you know who you are, and thank you again) and to a very generous donation from **Renishaw.**

The two new defibs, mentioned last month, and funded by **Kingswood Neighbourhood Watch**, are still awaiting delivery of the cabinets. The hold up is due to manufacturing delays resulting from the pandemic. In brief, the current 7 public access defibs in the village are located at: The Spar Shop, The Primary School (Abbey St), F+G Services Charfield Road, The Village Hall, Weavers Close, 59 Walkmill Lane, Bramley Close Flats' garage.

Kingswood Parish Council (KPC) operations during the Coronavirus: KPC has resumed its meetings at the village hall and will meet on the 2nd Monday of the month. The calendar, agenda and meeting papers can be found on the website as above. The next meeting will be on **Monday 13th September 2021.**

Anti-Social Behaviour: Please can all parents ensure that their children are not causing a nuisance at the playing field at night. We have had complaints of mopeds, loud music and littering. Please report any instances to the Police on 101 and to clerk@kingswoodparishcouncil.gov.uk. I will need a date and a time to find the incident on the camera and then be able to provide the evidence to the Police.

Playing field: KPC is now looking at delivering the outdoor accessible toilets at the playing field and it is hoped that this project will be completed by the end of 2022. At the same time as toilets KPC is considering if a Changing Places Facility would be appropriate at the playing field. The Council is interested in your views on this. The new fence at the playing field is in place, however we have noticed that people are leaving the vehicle access gate open. Please can you ensure this gate is closed after use.

Litter bins: The litter bins within the parish are provided by Stroud District Council and are emptied on a Tuesday. These bins are for the use of the community for their litter and dog poo bags when they are out and about. They are not there for business to use for their commercial waste or for residential waste. This has been a particular problem in connection with the bin at The Chipping adjacent to the shop.
