 New Road (B4058) between Wotton & Charfield. Note: there are also restricted-hours access defibs at KLB and the Wotton Sports Centre; and one by the all-weather pitches at Wotton Community Parc behind KLB – which is good for the park run and Skate Park.

Highways KPC is working in a new initiative with the Police on reducing speeding in the parish in connection with the ANPR cameras. We will share more information in the next Grapevine. The stolen ANPR camera will be replaced on Wotton Road. In the 2-week period it was in place it recorded 226 vehicles travelling at over 50mph, 28 of these were doing over 60mph and 4 were doing over 70mph. Once the new camera is in place, we will be working with the Police to reduce the speeding on this road which is used by children to access the school. The camera would also have registered the details of any incidents on Wotton Road. KPC has applied to Gloucestershire County Council for grant funding for a Road Safety Officers Report on highway safety issues within Kingswood. We have also applied for a mobile Vehicle activated sign (VAS) to work alongside the ANPR to inform drivers of the speed at which they are driving.

Anti-Social Behaviour - Can all cases of anti-social behaviour be reported to the Police at the time of the incident. It is only that way that action will be taken and a Police presence allocated to Kingswood as there will be a record of the incidences.
