Boundary Commission for England (BCE) Please see separate piece below. The consultation ends on 5th December 2022. **Planning Application** — New land Homes 32 houses, Walkmill Lane S.22/2473/FUL | Demolition of Orchestra Works and Associated Buildings, and development of no.32 new Zero Carbon dwellings, access from Walk Mill Lane, highways. Please see the Newland Homes application on the Stroud District Council's website. KPC will be discussing this in the December and January meetings. Please let the parish council know your views on this application and also respond directly to Stroud District Council.

Highways - Please see the Gloucestershire Highways Report into safety and speeding concerns in Kingswood on the KPC website under Highways. KPC are disappointed with the response. The Officer has assessed that speeding in Kingswood is a perceived issue and has turned down the application for a Vehicle Activated Speed Sign (VAS). However, the information sent to the Police via the cameras and the action taken by the Police confirm there is a speeding problem. KPC is managing the speeding on Charfield Road, Hillesley Road and Wickwar Road by working with the Police. The speeding on Wotton Road is serious and a concern to the Police who are putting in resources to catch speeding offenders. The report also states there is no solution to the problem with the giveaway junction on Wotton Road. Automated Number Plate Recognition Cameras (ANPR) reports- Please see the reports on the website. School Buses- KPC has had a disappointing response to the request to reroute the buses through Kingswood. KPC will along with County Councillor Linda Cohen will meet with the Highway Cabinet lead at Gloucestershire County Council to discuss what can be done to help with the issues of speeding, school buses and the give way junction at Wotton Road. KPC will update the Community in January 2023 on how they can assist KPC with resolving some of these issues. Allotments - If you are interested in an allotment Plot please contact the clerk to discuss. Antisocial behaviour- Please can all incidents of anti-social behaviour be reported to the Police. Unless the Police have reports there is no evidence of a problem existing, this then makes it harder for the problem to be dealt with. **Thanks** - KPC wish to thank all the volunteers for all their hard work in Kingswood. PARLIAMENTARY BOUNDARY CHANGES

You may not be aware that the Boundary Commission is proposing changes to our parliamentary constituency. Our existing constituency "The Cotswolds" is to be divided in to North Cotswolds and South Cotswolds. With Wotton-under-Edge being added to the Stroud Constituency, and bizarrely Kingswood added to the **South Cotswold** constituency. For residents of Kingswood there are two concerns: The opportunity to align our parliamentary constituency with our local authority (Stroud District Council) has been missed. And those who like to attend the hustings for parliamentary candidates currently held in Wotton-under-Edge, will now have to travel further afield to see and hear the prospective candidates. It is therefore even more important that you are aware of the location of your nearest public access defibrillator. **Important update**: There are currently 9 public access defibs in the parish and the location details of these defibs in Kingswood are now on the Grapevine's website. Go to www.kingswoodgrapevine.co.uk Find the Useful Links under Health and there you will find 2 links for the defibs. **Note**: A restricted-hours access defib is at KLB and the Wotton Sports Centre; and another by the all-weather pitches in the Wotton Community Parc – which is good for the park run and the Wotton Skate Park. **News:** I am expecting more defibs in Wotton soon (courtesy of the Lions); and there are 2 new defibs in Wickwar.
