30 candles – but how many more? March 17<sup>th</sup> was the 30th birthday of the R.N.L.I Wotton-under-Edge & District Branch (*now also covering Thornbury District*) - but the candles on the cake are burning low!

Since we formed, other local branches (Tetbury, Thornbury, Stroud, Cirencester) have all closed through the lack of new volunteers. We are at risk of going the same way; we have a committee of just five - and none of us are getting any younger. Next March sees the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of the RNLI; we would like to celebrate this anniversary, and many more, as a branch. We promote the RNLI, raise funds, promote the RNLI's safety messages, and provide support to others raising funds for the RNLI locally. We have some additional volunteers who help with street and store collections, and whom we can call upon to help with other events. However, we need new members on the committee to ensure that we can add more candles to our birthday cake. It does not require a big commitment, we meet only as needed (perhaps 4 times a year) to plan events and oversee the monies raised, and we plan what we do around the availability of our volunteers. We would welcome people with ideas, contacts or skills - even if they have limited availability to help with events. If you have found "Saving Lives at Sea" inspirational, you might consider getting involved – whether on the committee or as an occasional helper. Please contact me for further information.
