Wotton Road Give way point and school buses - KPC and the County Councillor Linda Cohen continue to raise this issue with the bus companies and Gloucestershire Highways. The obvious solution is to reroute the buses that do not need to come through the village to access KLB via New Road. South Gloucestershire County Council has agreed to do this. Sadly Gloucestershire Highways and Applegates refuse to see that this is an issue. If you see an incident of concern, please do not just go on Facebook, but take a picture and complain to Applegates and Gloucestershire Highways. The more reports they get the harder it will be to ignore this issue. Automated Number Plate Recognition Cameras (ANPR) reports - Please see the reports on the website. Together with action from the Police the cameras are succeeding in reducing speeding. There has been a 4% decrease in speeding on Wotton Road. Please be reminded that the 30mph speed limit applies with out exception. There is a noticeable increase in speeding on a Friday through to Sunday and during school holidays. KPC has asked the Polce to increase their checks at these times. Antisocial behaviour - Please can all incidents of anti-social behaviour be reported to the Police. Unless the Police have reports there is no evidence of a problem existing, this then makes it harder for the problem to be dealt with.
