Please attend and show your support if you can. KPC are continuing to raise questions with Highways on all the issues and are awaiting a response with solutions to discuss. Meanwhile the new term is looming. KLB will advise parents dropping off at KLB to use the main car park and not park on the road. Likewise, the Police will be monitoring Wotton Road outside KLB and the Wotton Road/Charfield Road junction. Any vehicle perceived to be causing an obstruction will be asked to be moved or worse case will be ticketed. Please can all issues, near misses or bad parking be reported to the Police. Knowing where public access defibs are could help save a life, so this is important:- There are currently 9 public access AEDs (defibs) in the parish. Their locations are detailed on the Grapevine's website, in both map form and as a picture-locator. Some have found it hard to find these details on the website, so, repeating what was in December's edition: Go to www.kingswoodgrapevine.co.uk. Click the drop down menu bar in top right corner (3 horizontal bars, aka the hamburger icon), you will get a list. Or scroll down to USEFUL LINKS, then scroll down to HEALTH, and there you will find 2 links for the defibs - one for a location map and the other for a montage of location pictures with access details. Top tip: copy one or both of the images to your smart phone now.
