#### KINGSWOOD DEFIB AWARENESS GROUP

The Village Hall now has a new defibrillator, and this has the benefit of being more user-friendly than its predecessor. However the old defib will still work (but without child pads), so I am exploring whether the football and cricket clubs etc might find it useful to take to away matches or other events. Of course new defibrillators don't come cheap, so contributions from any source will be most welcome.

A recap: there are 9 defibs available 24/7 in the parish, and a further 3 available at certain times. These are shown on the map on the Grapevine's website. Alternatively, a good way to locate your nearest defib is to use www.defibfinder.uk is the official UK site and will only show defibs that are currently available. Just put in the postcode.

#### KINGSWOOD VILLAGE ROAD SAFETY GROUP (KVRSG)

A plea from the Kingswood Village Road Safety Group (KVRSG). Please respect the new white H lines on Wotton Road opposite Tubbs Turf and avoid blocking the dropped curb. They have been painted there by Gloucestershire County Council to prevent some of the parking issues. Our aim is to try and make it safe for our children walking to school, after 3 children were clipped by passing vehicles, resulting in a fractured elbow for one. It's impossible to cross the road safely when cars block the dropped curb and park on the white lines. Please consider wheelchair users and buggies too. Pedestrians cannot see the traffic clearly when their view is blocked by parked cars.

Rule 243 of the Highway Code - DO NOT stop or park: - opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space - where the kerb has been lowered to help wheelchair users and powered mobility vehicles We need the support of the community to improve our road safety. Thank you.

The Community Pantry and Drop-in Café continue to operate successfully and provide valuable resources for everyone in Kingswood. The pantry in St Mary's is open from 10am to 4pm Monday to Saturday where basic foodstuffs and toiletries are available, and in the run-up to Christmas we plan to stock some seasonal treats such as festive biscuits and selection boxes. Everyone is welcome to access the goods on the shelves at the back of the church on a "take what you need" basis and if you have anything to donate, especially Christmas items, they can be left in the church porch. Our café continues to welcome visitors in the Lower School Room on Tuesdays and Fridays, where there's the opportunity to socialise over coffee and cake. It's also nicely heated and provides a welcome warm space as we move into the colder winter months. We have been happy to meet Kingswood Primary children in the café on Tuesday afternoons after school, who have enjoyed our cake, biscuits and fruit juice. We have some games and pastimes available for them which have proved popular. All we ask is that all children are accompanied and supervised by a carer.
