Planning S.20/0887/FUL Land at Cloverlea Barn and the build of 52 houses. This application was the subject of an appeal hearing at Stroud District Council Office on the 16th April 2024. KPC attended the hearing and the site meeting. This application has been given permission. Decision note is on the KPC website on the Planning page. Elections 2024 - This will take place on the 4th July 2024. Please note that Kingswood is in the new parliamentary constituency of South Cotswold. Full details of the boundary review are on the KPC website under current consultations. 2023/24 Accounts- The year end accounts have been finalised and are now on the website. The Public rights to view the accounts will run from 3rd June to 12th July 2024. Please contact the clerk to make an appointment at a mutually agreed time. Resilient Energy fund - Please see the link to the grant funding available to community groups in Kingswood. The deadline for the next award of grants is 31st October 2024. Application form - Resilient Energy: Mounteneys Renewables Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) for waiting restrictions on Wotton Road consultation runs until noon 5th July 2024. Please see full details on the Gloucestershire County Council( GCC) webpage link Waiting Restrictions - Kingswood | Highways (gloucestershire.gov.uk) Please can you comment directly to the consultation. The proposal is the only solution put forward by the responsible authority for road safety GCC, to concerns raised by the community. Depending on the results of the community response, changes could be implemented in line with the proposal. Please be aware that this is the only proposal for Wotton Road. GCC has dismissed the following solutions - traffic lights, a one-way system, school crossing patrol and a crossing. Voting no will not mean that these will be considered. Vote yes if you believe the road will be safer with the proposed changes, Vote no if you believe the road will be safer as it is. KPC will continue to work for road safety and are still working on re-routing the buses, the implementation of a 20mph speed limit for Wotton Road, a Vehicle activated sign for Wotton Road, safety crossing throughout the village, Solar lights from KLB to Kingswood, a new school pick up and drop off point and a safe route for pedestrians and cyclists as part of the Greenway proposal. KPC will be discussing an application for a 20mph speed limit for Wotton Road from Vineyard lane. The next parish council meeting will be on Monday 8th July at Kingswood Village Hall at 7.15pm

Everything is growing quickly including the recently planted trees and all the grass areas. Volunteers are working hard to keep the pathways cut to improve access for everyone to enjoy. Grass snakes are regularly spotted bathing in the main pond and caused much excitement for the youngsters who came to the surveys in May & June. All three native species of newts – smooth, palmate and even the protected Great Crested Newts were found in two of the three ponds. This year we found quite a few efts (the newt equivalent of frog tadpoles) indicating an earlier breeding season than usual. A note to dog walkers - please ensure dog poo is bagged and *removed* as finding this while strimming grass/manually picking up cuttings is unpleasant and a health risk for volunteers. Many thanks to dog owners who we know pick up any dog poo while walking.
