They informed me they never send text messages and any fine would be in a letter sent to my house". Kingswood Playing Field – KPC has been working with Crest Nicholson (CN) and Stroud District Council (SDC) to resolve the access for the contractor to be able to maintain the drainage ditch adjacent to the playing field. The lack of maintenance due to no access to the drainage ditch has affected the playing field, the football club and residents of Boundary Close. KPC, CN and SDC have now reached an agreement on the necessary proposed works. Crest Nicholson has confirmed that the bridge will be dismantled w/c 23/09/24 and that there will be no public access for at least 6 weeks. The KPC contractor will go in and clear the ditch area from 7/10/24. It is hoped that once these essential works are carried out the threat of flooding of the surrounding area will be diminished. There will be further works planned at a later date to amend the culvert. We apologise for the inconvenience and will keep you notified. Cloverlea Barn Wickwar Road. - Stroud District Council has asked for suggestions for naming the road on the proposed new development at Wickwar Road. KPC will consider this request, and any suggestions received in its meeting on 14th October. Please forward any suggestions to the Clerk. Highway Safety - It is important that all incidents are reported to the Police. Unless incidents are recorded the Police and Glos Highways will remain convinced that the roads in Kingswood are safe. This will not help when we ask for improvements such as speed reductions and a vehicle activated sign.
