Creative writing - there is no eligibility criteria for this course - it is open to everyone. Four Thursdays 11.30 - 1pm. Starting **10th October.** We're thrilled to announce the return of Creative Writing Workshops, led by the talented local author and playwright Mark Seaman.

IT for beginners - Monday 4th November - Monday 16th of December. 1.30pm – 3.30pm. The course is free if you are over 19 years old, have lived in the UK/ EU for 3 or more years, or have a valid Residence Permit, and are one of the following: Unemployed/retired or earning below £25,000 per year; Qualified below a Level 2 (less than 5 GCSEs); Have mental health challenges, Have a learning difficulty or disability. If you dont fulfil the eligibility criteria - you can still attend the course - and pay £5 a session.
