Kingswood Playing Field - The KPC contractor successfully accessed and cleared the ditch. We are currently awaiting Crest Nicholson to put the bridge back together to enable safe access to the playing field. We are also awaiting details on how and when the culvert will be moved to ensure that the ditch can drain efficiently. Cloverlea Barn Wickwar Road - Stroud District Council has agreed to name the new road at the Cloverlea Barn development Wickwar Road, Cloverlea Barn. Thank you for all of your suggestions. KINGSWOOD VILLAGE ROAD SAFETY GROUP

Can we politely request that drivers do not park in front of the dropped kerb on Wotton Road by the Tennis Courts or on the white lines. Cars are still blocking the dropped kerb which is illegal and can result in a parking fine. The white lines were introduced to improve road safety. If cars park there it blocks visibility for people, including school children who need to see oncoming traffic to cross the road safety. We have witnessed several wheel chair users unable to cross the road as the dropped kerb is blocked. KVRSG have been campaigning to improve the road safety in the village after children were clipped by passing cars on Wotton Road on the way home from school. This is a high traffic area at school drop off especially and we need to keep children and our residents safe. Thank you.
